# Writing a Lament: A pattern for crying out to God in trouble

A lament is a form of a prayer used when people who are in trouble cry out to God for his help. It provides a good pattern for expressing our need as well as our trust in God.

# **Example Lament Psalms**

• Psalm 3, 22, 31, 39, 42, 57, 71, 88, 120, 139, 142

### Typical lament structure

- Address (we are speaking to God)
- Complaint (what isn't right)
- Statement of Trust (our confidence in God's goodness and power)
- Petition (what we need God to do)
- Poetic exclamations (optional ways to ask for God's help)
- Certainty / Anticipation of Praise

# Example

Psalm 3: A psalm of David. When he fled from his son Absalom.

#### Address

<sup>1</sup> LORD,

#### Complaint

how many are my foes!

How many rise up against me!

<sup>2</sup> Many are saying of me,

"God will not deliver him."

## Statement of Trust

<sup>3</sup> But you, LORD, are a shield around me, my glory, the One who lifts my head high.

<sup>4</sup> I call out to the LORD, and he answers me from his holy mountain.

<sup>5</sup> I lie down and sleep;

I wake again, because the LORD sustains me.

<sup>6</sup> I will not fear though tens of thousands assail me on every side.

#### Petition

<sup>7</sup> Arise, LORD!

Deliver me, my God!

Strike all my enemies on the jaw;

break the teeth of the wicked.
