Destruction and violence are before me; there is strife, and conflict abounds.

⁴ Therefore the law is paralyzed, and justice never prevails.






It is good to rejoice when we experience God's goodness

It shows His glory more clearly





Aphantasia


Inability to visualize what our eyes aren't seeing Treatment
