2 Corinthians 4

Paul will say:

Following God can be disheartening so we can be tempted to find easier roads

- But God brings His Light into our darkness God puts His goodness into our troubles (like treasure into clay pots) as it was for Jesus: death brought life
- So by faith we are inwardly strengthened, to the praise of God in future glory

Therefore, since through God's mercy we have this ministry, we do not lose heart.

² Rather, we have renounced secret and shameful ways; we do not use deception, nor do we distort the word of God. On the contrary, by setting forth the truth plainly we commend ourselves to everyone's conscience in the sight of God.

³ And even if our gospel is veiled, it is veiled to those who are perishing. ⁴ The god of this age has blinded the minds of unbelievers, so that they cannot see the light of the gospel that displays the glory of Christ, who is the image of God. ⁵ For what we preach is not ourselves, but Jesus Christ as Lord, and ourselves as your servants for Jesus' sake. ⁶ For God, who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," made his light shine in our hearts to give us the light of the knowledge of God's glory displayed in the face of Christ.

⁷ But we have this treasure in jars of clay to show that this all-surpassing power is from God and not from us. ⁸ We are hard pressed on every side, _____ but not crushed; perplexed, _____ but not in despair; ⁹ persecuted, _____ but not abandoned; struck down, ______ but not destroyed. ¹⁰ We always carry around in our body the death of Jesus, so that <u>the life of Jesus may also be revealed</u> <u>in our body</u>. ¹¹ For we who are alive are always <u>being given over to death for Jesus' sake</u>, <u>so that</u> <u>his life may also be revealed in our mortal body</u>. ¹² So then, death is at work in us, but life is at work in you.

¹³ It is written: "I believed; therefore I have spoken." Since we have that same spirit of faith, we also believe and therefore speak, ¹⁴ because we know that the one who raised the Lord Jesus from the dead will also raise us with Jesus and present us with you to himself. ¹⁵ All this is for your benefit, so that the grace that is reaching more and more people may cause thanksgiving to overflow to the glory of God.

¹⁶ Therefore we do not lose heart. 

What is seen→ What is obvious now


What is unseen

→ What will be true after death




The Big Idea 2

By God's design as we live in the Gospel... we live in weakness and trouble with inner renewal today for future eternal glory


This is the nature of true discipleship













What are we to do?
