



1:1-4: Habakkuk: How long will you tolerate wrongdoing?

1:5-11: God: I am raising up the a ruthless people

1:12-2:1: **Habakkuk**: Will you really let the wicked swallow up your people?

2:2-20: God: Judgment will come at the appointed time

3:1-15: Habakkuk sees God's awesome judgment

3:16-19: Habakkuk trembles, and rejoices in God by faith

The Big Idea

Joy in the storm is the work of God in us through faith in Him

It is good to rejoice when we experience God's goodness Rejoicing in God when we aren't experiencing His goodness is a purer faith: It shows His glory more clearly

"For our light and momentary troubles are achieving for us an eternal glory that far outweighs them all. So we fix our eyes not on what is seen, but on what is unseen, since what is seen is temporary, but what is unseen is eternal." 2 Corinthians 4:17-18

The entire present world order may pass away But God's grace to his people is limitless forever!



Aphantasia

Inability to visualize what our eyes aren't seeing

<u>Treatment</u>: Imagery training → draw, paint, describe

We don't see everything subject to Jesus now

"But we do see Jesus, who was made lower than the angels for a little while, now crowned with glory and honor because he suffered death, so that by the grace of God he might taste death for everyone."

What are we to do?

Fix the eyes of our hearts on our unseen God
