What Kind of Messiah?

Matthew 16:21-28

Stage 1 Learning

Creation → Fall → God's people & Messiah → Re-Creation

Stage 2 Learning

God's people fall short All hope is put on the Messiah The Messiah is Jesus (Matthew 16:13-19)



Matthew 16:21

Stage 3 Learning

The Messiah (Jesus) must suffer and die on the cross before being raised to glory

Matthew 16:22-23

Matthew 16:24-27

Stage 4 Learning

Jesus' disciples must also suffer and take up their cross before being raised to glory

Matthew 16:28

And God will gives glimpses of Glory

The Big Idea

Following Jesus requires self-denial and involves hardship now and leads to overwhelming glory when we see Jesus

What are we to do?

Listen carefully to Jesus

We CANNOT maximize earthly values and eternal good We must either deny ourselves or deny Christ

Follow Jesus fully

Jesus lived what He taught He made Himself nothing, obeying to death And THEN He received overwhelming glory Which He longs for us to enjoy also

Praise God for glimpses of glory

Be super cautious of "merely human thinking"

Doing what 'makes sense' can align us with Satan

Conversation starters with people in daily life, whether or not they are Christians
