Jesus surrendered His rights so He wouldn't hinder people's paths to God

He expects His disciples to follow Him

Running is hard

Temptations for relief make it harder

"Comments" make it harder

Finding and Following Jesus

can be hard

Stumbling blocks make it harder

Disciples sacrifice their rights rather than being a stumbling block to others

What are we to do?

For other Christians, sacrifice our rights

"Therefore, if what I eat causes my brother or sister to fall into sin, I will never eat meat again, so that I will not cause them to fall."

1 Corinthians 8:13

For people finding Jesus, sacrifice our rights

"I have become all things to all people, so that I may by every possible means save some."

1 Corinthians 9:22

"In your relationships with one another, have the same mindset as Christ Jesus: Who, being in very nature God,

did not consider equality with God

something to be used to his own advantage;

rather, he made himself nothing

by taking the very nature of a servant,

being made in human likeness.

And being found in appearance as a man,

he humbled himself

by becoming obedient to death—
even death on a cross!"

- 4. How can we discern when an issue is not secondary, and it is worth holding to even if it becomes a stumbling block to others?
